### REQUIREMENTS FOR A BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN SOCIAL WORK

In order to obtain a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work, a student must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Obtain formal admission to the social work program.
- 2. Meet requirements for beginning and advanced Fieldwork.
- 3. Obtain a grade of "D" or better in all social work courses.
- 4. Maintain an overall GPA of 2.5.
- 5. Complete general studies and all other degree requirements.

Formal admission to the social work program

- 1. Requirements
  - a. Completion of at least 40 semester hours toward a degree.
  - b. Completion of SW 215, Introduction to Social Work.
  - c. An overall GPA of 2.2.
  - d. Possession of personal qualities consistent with NASW Code of Ethics (See reference letter and personal aptitude for S.W. Profession).
- 2. Application Procedure

Application Packets are available in the Social Work Program office, 209 Founders Hall. A complete application packet consists of:

- a. Application for Admission to the Social Work Program form
- b. Three reference forms\*:
  - 1. At least one from a social work faculty member
  - 2. One from an agency volunteer or supervisor, if applicable, social work employer, or minister
  - 3. One from another MHU faculty member
- c. Self-Awareness Essay
- d. Current official college transcript

# \*NOTE: Transfer students: If you transferred from a social work or human services program, one of your references must be from that program.

The student must complete each item in the application packet according to instructions. No incomplete packets will be considered. An incomplete packet will be kept on file until the packet is complete. Contact the social work department with questions.

- 3. Criteria for acceptance into the social work program
  - a. Submission of complete application packet by deadline date each semester.
  - b. Judgment of satisfactory essay by social work admissions committee.
  - c. A majority of "above average" and "outstanding" ratings on reference forms.
  - d. Judgment of suitability for professional social work. (This evaluation will be drawn from compilation of admissions packet.)

In addition, acceptance into the social work program will be based upon the social work admissions committee's assessment of the student's potential for graduating with a BSW degree, and the student's interest and commitment to the pursuit of a career in the field of social services.

4. Time frames for admission application

Application Deadline

Student Notification Date

Spring semester - the week after Spring Break Summer term – mid-July Transfer students – before the start of the enrolling semester

Within a week of program interview

5. The admission decision

The social work admissions committee has responsibility for making decisions for acceptance into the program. The committee will be composed of faculty members and members of the Social Work Program Advisory Board. At least two committee members must agree in order for a student's application to be accepted. The committee will review the application and will make a decision as follows:

- a. Approve as a social work major
- b. Provisional Acceptance Approve on satisfactory completion of specified conditions
- c. Disapprove

A list of applicants and the decisions of the committee will be circulated to the entire social work faculty for review. If any social work faculty member has questions about any decision, he/she may request a second review of a particular applicant. A final decision on admission of the applicant in question will be made by a majority vote of the entire social work faculty and Social Work Program Advisory Board.

The student will be notified in writing of the committee's decision. Acceptance as a social work major does not automatically guarantee acceptance into SW 361: Junior Field Internship.

#### 6. Appeal of admission decision

If the decision is "disapprove," the student may request a second review and may provide additional information for review by the committee. If the committee's decision is still "disapprove" after the second review, the student may appeal in writing to the social work program director. The director may convene a committee of the entire social work faculty for further review. The student may appeal the social work faculty's decision of "disapprove" to the Academic Dean.

The Dean's decision will be final.

7. Successful completion (grade of "D" or better) of S.W. 215, Introduction to Social Work.
