

2019–2020 Verification Worksheet Dependent Student

Your 2019–2020 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you and your parents reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided correct information the financial aid administrator at your school will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You and at least one parent whose information was reported on the FAFSA must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid office at your school. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact your financial aid office as soon as possible to avoid delays.
